Consider the situation where the number of atoms in solid A, N_A , is 5 and the number of atoms in solid B, N_B , is also 5. Let the total amount of energy be 20 times the energy difference between energy levels of the Einsteinean oscillator.

1. How many different ways are there to divide this total energy between the two solids?

- 5. What is the average energy per atom in each solid in this macropartition?
- 6. What range of values of the ration U_A/U corresponds to macropartitions whose probabilities are at least one-half as large as the most probable macropartition?
